This time, there are NO letters to get you started, but here are some clues:

- Single letter words will either be an I or an A.
- A word of 5 or more letters with G as the final letter probably ends ING.
- There are no J's, K's, Qs, V's, W's, X's and Z's.

BUT the BIG CLUE: Three of these words are the same word: PROPERTY. The word ENGLISH is in there too. Somewhere.
